

Starting from Tuesday 28th Feb, the Clongriffin Community Association (CCA) are so excited to announce that it has been chosen by Tesco Extra Clarehall as one of the 3 groups to receive a proportion of the Tesco Community Fund for the next three months. Today members of both the CCA and our Tidy Towns group, including our fantastic junior litter monitors, popped down to the store to start the process.

Every 12 weeks, each Tesco store donates up to €2,000 from it's Community Fund between three local good causes in its community.

Customers decide how the Fund is shared by placing the blue token they receive at the checkout in the donation box of the local good cause they would most like to support. At the end of the 12 weeks, the number of tokens is counted and up to €2,000 is distributed proportionally between three local good causes.

We would really appreciate your support as the more tokens the Clongriffin Community Association gets, the larger share of the donation we will receive. We are a self funded organisation entirely reliant on donations. If you shop in Tesco Extra Clarehall over the next three months, please remember to get you token and pop it in our box and if you don't maybe you might consider switching some of your grocery shops to help us out.
